My Thoughts on the Kingdoms of Daniel Chapter 7

The First Kingdom (Daniel 7:4) It sounds like the great King Nebuchadnezzar's kingdom. His wings were plucked for the seven years of his humbling. (see Daniel chapter 4)

The Second Kingdom (Daniel 7:5) This sounds like it might be the Persians who replaced the Chaldean kingdom of Nebuchadnezzar during the reign of Belshazzar. Darius was probably their greatest king.

The Third Kingdom (Daniel 7:6) Darius and the Persians were overthrown by Alexander the Great. He moved like a leopard conquering Persia, Egypt, Asia and India in six years. This creature had four heads. As soon as Alexander conquered the known civilized world, he died and his kingdom was divided up between his four generals (heads). Those four separate parts of his kingdom lasted until Rome came on the scene.

The Fourth Kingdom (Daniel 7:7-26) I believe that this kingdom is the Roman empire, which when it was at its Zenith, was comprised of ten smaller kingdoms (horns), Italy, Spain, France, Germany, Britain, Sarmatia, Pannonia, Asia, Greece and Egypt. Others think that this fourth beast is the kingdom of Syria, the family of Seleucidae, which was very cruel and oppressive to the Jews, which we find in Josephus and the history of the Maccabees. Matthew Henry's Commentary gives the following reasons why some people think the fourth kingdom refers to Syria: "And herein that empire was divers from those which went before, that none of the proceeding powers compelled the Jews to renounce their religion, but the kings of Syria did, and used them barbarously. Their armies and commanders and commanders would be the great iron teeth with which they devoured and broke in pieces the people of God, and they trampled upon the residue of them. The ten horns are then supposed to be the ten kings that reigned successively in Syria; and then the little horn would be Antiochus Epiphanes, the last of the ten, who by one means or another, undermined three of the kings and got the government. He was a man of great ingenuity, and therefore is said to have eyes like the eyes of a man: and he was very bold and daring and had a mouth speaking great things." There are sometimes partial fulfillments of prophecies that take place before the final fulfillment comes.

If, as I believe, the Fourth Kingdom represents the Roman empire, then it lasted until the coming of Christ and I believe it will be revived in the time of the Tribulation when the "beast" (the little horn) will be given authority to persecute the saints for....
